

THE SEVEN TRUMPETS

Revelation 8-11

TRACK 1: Are new to the Bible, or do you have limited time available? If so, this track is for you! Each week, we'll provide key verses centered around the main points of the sermon. Follow the steps below:

1. This week, there are two key passages, if time allows, you can meditate on both – OR - simply focus on the last letter, the letter to Laodicea. Print the passage(s) and keep handy.
2. Read it often, asking God to help you understand and show you things about your own life.
3. Set aside one time during the week to write your insights in a journal. Use the tips below.

Journaling Tips:

- What does this say about Jesus? About His character, or how to follow Him?
- Are there any words of encouragement? Words of warning and conviction?
- What eternal truths or principles do I find in these verses?
- What is the Holy Spirit trying to teach me through these verses? What changes do I need to make in my life to act on what I am learning?

Revelation 9:17-21

¹⁷ The horses and riders I saw in my vision looked like this: Their breastplates were fiery red, dark blue, and yellow as sulfur. The heads of the horses resembled the heads of lions, and out of their mouths came fire, smoke and sulfur. ¹⁸ A third of mankind was killed by the three plagues of fire, smoke and sulfur that came out of their mouths. ¹⁹ The power of the horses was in their mouths and in their tails; for their tails were like snakes, having heads with which they inflict injury.

²⁰ The rest of mankind who were not killed by these plagues still did not repent of the work of their hands; they did not stop worshiping demons, and idols of gold, silver, bronze, stone and wood—idols that cannot see or hear or walk. ²¹ Nor did they repent of their murders, their magic arts, their sexual immorality or their thefts.

Revelation 10:8-10

⁸ Then the voice that I had heard from heaven spoke to me once more: “Go, take the scroll that lies open in the hand of the angel who is standing on the sea and on the land.”

⁹ So I went to the angel and asked him to give me the little scroll. He said to me, “Take it and eat it. It will turn your stomach sour, but ‘in your mouth it will be as sweet as honey.’” ¹⁰ I took the little scroll from the angel’s hand and ate it. It tasted as sweet as honey in my mouth, but when I had eaten it, my stomach turned sour.

Revelation 11:15-18

¹⁵ The seventh angel sounded his trumpet, and there were loud voices in heaven, which said:

“The kingdom of the world has become
the kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah,
and he will reign for ever and ever.”

¹⁶ And the twenty-four elders, who were seated on their thrones before God, fell on their faces and worshiped God, ¹⁷ saying:

“We give thanks to you, Lord God Almighty,
the One who is and who was,
because you have taken your great power
and have begun to reign.

¹⁸ The nations were angry,
and your wrath has come.
The time has come for judging the dead,
and for rewarding your servants the prophets
and your people who revere your name,
both great and small—
and for destroying those who destroy the earth.”
