Monday

Read Revelation 6:1 – 6:4 - The white and red horsemen

- 1. Describe the white and red horsemen. What weapons does each have? What is each given?
- 2. Pastor Dave mentions that the white horseman is symbol for deception. He is described as heroic in the text. What does spiritual deception look like in our world today?
- 3. The red horseman has power to 'take peace from the Earth'. What does could that mean in the last days?

Tuesday

Read Revelation 6:5 – 6:7 – The black and pale horsemen

- 1. Describe the white and red horsemen. What weapons does each have? What is each given?
- 2. The black horseman represents famine and food shortages. Where in the Bible have we seen this before? Where else in history have we seen this?
- 3. God is sovereign throughout the events mentioned here. He works all things for good. How can God work what is described here for good?

Wednesday

Read Revelation 6:9 – 6:15 – The fifth and sixth seal

- 1. Who are the people seen in this altar? What do they have in common?
- 2. There is a demand of accountability seen here. Where do we demand accountability in our lives?
- 3. Who is trying to hide in verse 15? What does this say about the world? What does it say about God?

Thursday

Read Revelation 7: 1-17 - The 144,000

- 1. What is the significance of the word 'sealed' used here?
- 2. Some scholars say that the number 144,000 is literal, while others say it is symbolic. Where is the number 12 used elsewhere in the Bible?
- 3. What can believers look forward to in the days to come?

Friday

- 1. What was your most significant takeaway from this week's sermon, scripture reading, or discussion with your small group?
- 2. As a believer we wait for when we are with God. How has this week's study helped you think about the process of waiting?
