### **WORSHIP IN HEAVEN**

Revelation 4 & 5

Track 2: This is for those who wish to dig deeper and have more times to commit. Read the daily Scripture passage and work through the questions provided. Recording your insights in a journal will increase your retention and give you a record of what God is doing in your life!

## Monday

#### Read Revelation 4:1-8

- 1. What imagery do you see here that reveals God's character to us? Is there any symbolism you see in these passages? Journal or discuss together in your group. You can also take some time to look up Bible commentary for more information on the imagery used here.
- 2. What are circumstances in your life that affect your perspective in a negative way? What are distractions that keep you from worshipping God enough?
- 3. Why does knowing the truth that God is in control of ALL things encourage you to worship him more?

## Tuesday

#### Read Revelation 4:8-5:5

- 1. What do we see about God's character in these verses?
- 2. As chapter 5 begins, what kind of transition happens in what John is seeing? Describe what he sees and how it relates to God's complete and perfect plan.
- 3. We are told that this was a highly emotional event for John. Put yourself in his shoes. How do you think you would feel if you were to have been given this vision?

### Wednesday

### Read Revelation 5:6-10

- 1. What is the significance of seeing a lamb here in these verses?
- 2. How has God turned our whole idea of power on its head? Think of examples elsewhere in the Bible as well.
- 3. How can everything we do in life be an act of worship?

## **Thursday**

# Read Revelation 5:11-14

- 1. What imagery is used here to convey the sovereignty and power of God?
- 2. Pastor Ted said, "Anytime you set aside what you want to do and instead do what God wants you to do, that's an act of worship." What are your thoughts on this and how have you seen this play out in your life?
- 3. What are the benefits of worshiping God together in community?

## Friday

- 1. What was your most significant takeaway from this week's sermon, scripture reading, or discussion with your small group?
- 2. Has what we learned this week inspired you to worship differently? What changes will your make in how you worship in your daily life?"
